


New T Level in Engineering

This year we are launching our new T Level Technical Qualification in Maintenance, Installation and Repair for Engineering and Manufacturing.

The T Level is a two-year full-time programme which blends technical training to develop your skills and knowledge using the latest industry-standard equipment, alongside substantial work placements with some of the biggest names in the engineering sector.

You will specialise in mechatronics, focusing on robotics, programmable logic control, hydraulics and pneumatics as well as the principles of mechanical and electrical engineering. UCAS tariff points will be allocated, equivalent in value to three A levels.

Students on our full-time programmes can learn about a wide range of engineering professions in preparation for an apprenticeship, higher education or full-time employment.

Apprenticeships

SWDT works in partnership with many employers, from individual tradespersons to multinationals, and has an excellent track record of training apprentices in a range of sectors and specialisms.

We offer Level 3 apprenticeships in a range of pathways including electrical and mechanical, Machining technician, fabrication and welding.

The first year of your apprenticeship is often fulltime in the training centre (at your employer's discretion) building up to four days in your workplace and one day at SWDT for practical training, theory, assessment and study support.

You earn as you learn, with a minimum apprenticeship wage of £5.28 per hour aged 16, but many employers pay more than this and the average UK apprentice wage is between £15,000 to £30,000.


